Anyway, what you get is MD5 as 16 binary bytes stored in String.

What you need to do is to convert them one by one to hex to get the result.

E.g. (not quite optimal speedwise):

```
String x = MD5Digets(...);
String r;
for(int i = 0; i < x.GetCount(); i++)
  r << FormatIntHex(x[i], 2);</pre>
```

should work.
