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Basically you may hack it by changing dots to commas before atof:

```
#include <Core/Core.h>
using namespace UPP;
CONSOLE_APP_MAIN
{
    String real = "254.6";
    int dotindex;
    while ( (dotindex = real.Find('.')) != -1 ) real.Set(dotindex, ',');
    Cout().Put(real); Cout().PutEol();
}
```
