If that is your situation

koldo wrote on Sat, 09 May 2009 15:15 I think I understand you: when your program is running although hidden in the tray you want to open it by clicking some keys like the Ctrl+Ctrl used for Google Desktop, isn't it?

you can do this in Windows:

To monitor keys, for example left Control key, you have to call `GetKeyState()`.

This function answers you if the key is pressed and if it is toggled (this serves too for keys that are not the Caps-Lock!).

A sample:

```
char k = GetKeyState(VK_LCONTROL);  
if (k & 1)  
    puts("Toggled");  
if (k & 128)  
    puts("Pressed");
```

This works although your program is not focused, and does not affect to the normal keyboard use, I mean, you will not steal keys to anybody.

When your program is in the tray you can enter it in a loop that checks every 100 ms the Ctrl
