If you don't see these options or the window doesn't appear, it is either problem with your SVN installation (but then neither the SVN history would work, so it is probably not the case) or it might be a bug.

The history works fine. None of the context menus have the SVN menu. From the command shell (cmd.exe) the "svn" command works fine and that's what I've been using for a very long time, but I decided to get back to using the IDE for SVN commits because it is much easier/nicer. I just couldn't find it again.

Maybe you could try the standalone usvn client. It is in uppsrc, just compile it and run in your working copy directory. It is the same code as in the IDE, so if there is some problem in the code, it should be broken too and possibly easier to debug.

The GUI works fine.
