The idea behind ASSERT is that it should never, ever trigger. The condition in it is usually protecting something that would lead into application crash or data coruption, so it is usually safer to let the application crash in semi-controllable manner before it demages something. But as I said alreay: good production code should never trigger them anyway

If you want to use them in debug mode, then you'll have to define your own, using something like the code in the first post.
