It is true. Anyway if when asking for the key the user sends you all that info (encrypted):

- you know if it is run on a virtual system. You can deny it

- If they say they changed the HD, you will see everything unchanged but the HD code

- Nowadays all PCs have an embedded network hardware so you have a MAC. It is of course possible to change the MAC, but computers with the same MAC cannot live in the same network .

They can purchase PC clones with the same MAC unconnected to LAN or Internet... well but different HD so It is very difficult to handle.

Because of it I think it is worthwhile to have the key in a file. Many people does it alone or combining it with a web authentication just when Internet is available.
