Hello Koldo,

Following two lines of code are tricky:

for (FindFile ff(AppendFileName("/etc/", "\*-release")); ff; ff.Next())
release += LoadFile\_Safe(ff.GetPath());

This means, that find all files, that have "release" chain in their names. File "lsb-release" dosen't contain full version information, so we need to scan other files with "release" in their names.

Here is the output (Ubuntu 13.04): DISTRIB\_VERSION=13.04 VERSION=13.04, Raring Ringtail

VERSION can be replaced with VERSION\_ID (And even DISTRIB\_VERSION to ID): VERSION\_ID=13.04 ID=ubuntu

You can type following command in your terminal: "cat /etc/\*-release":

DISTRIB\_ID=Ubuntu DISTRIB\_RELEASE=13.04 DISTRIB\_CODENAME=raring DISTRIB\_DESCRIPTION="Ubuntu 13.04" NAME="Ubuntu" VERSION="13.04, Raring Ringtail" ID=ubuntu ID\_LIKE=debian PRETTY\_NAME="Ubuntu 13.04" VERSION\_ID="13.04" VERSION\_ID="13.04" HOME\_URL="http://www.ubuntu.com/" SUPPORT\_URL="http://help.ubuntu.com/" BUG\_REPORT\_URL="http://bugs.launchpad.net/ubuntu/"

Personally, I think we can add more information about distribution to SysInfo.
