These files have accented names, and were copied first from Windows to Linux and then copied back to Windows. Windows does not complain and can open or copy these files without problems, but I cannot show its names using QTF.

Now, there might be error in U++... If you are using U++ to read those file names, e.g. FindFile, and you have default charset (UTF-8), then you should already get them in UTF-8 (from FindFile).
