Hello,

If everything is added correctly, we need to check that "MyAppps" assembly is configured correctly. As I said before - you need to check this by your own and post screenshot.

When you open TheIDE for the first time, the window with main package list will show. On the left side of the window - you will have the list of assemblies. There you will find "MyApps". Double click on it or right click on it and select "Edit assembly..". Then make the screen-shot and post it here. I do not need more screen-shot that shows the linking error. The assembly nest for your configuration should look like this

```
C:\MyApps;C:\upp\uppsrc  
(ValidPathToMyApps;ValidPathToUppsrc)
```

I believe "ValidPathToUppsrc" can be accidentally deleted by you when you manually configured "MyApps" custom directory. You need to be careful there.

If you open the dialog - open "uppsrc" assembly to and make sure the path that is shown there is presented in the "MyApps" assembly.
