Well, from that example it looks, like you need the SPF\_ASYNC flag, which I found described here.

No Set/KillTimeCallback should be necessary for this. Just launch the Speak with the async flag in Start button callback and stop it by Stop button callback, which calls something like Speak("", SPF\_PURGEBEFORESPEAK, NULL).
