Hmm, that's bad.

I'm not on Ubuntu, but you can try a trick I use sometimes:

Try ldd to get the paths for TheIDE (ldd can show the required libraries linked against theIDE's executable):

#Idd /usr/bin/theide # if it is the right path, I mean.

You can check the paths.

The output should be something like this:

linux-vdso.so.1 (0x00007ffd5b64b000) libc.so.6 => /usr/lib/libc.so.6 (0x00007f9c2c110000) libglib-2.0.so.0 => /usr/lib/libglib-2.0.so.0 (0x00007f9c2bfe8000)libgio-2.0.so.0 => /usr/lib/libgio-2.0.so.0 (0x00007f9c2be30000) $libgobject-2.0.so.0 \Rightarrow /usr/lib/libgobject-2.0.so.0 (0x00007f9c2bdd0000)$ libgtk-3.so.0 => /usr/lib/libgtk-3.so.0 (0x00007f9c2b6f0000)

libgdk-3.so.0 => /usr/lib/libgdk-3.so.0 (0x00007f9c2b5f0000)
