The main argument for using switch like -A -B is to be flexible and POSIX friendly. You don't have to follow strict rules on parameters order anymore.

Those commands are the same:

```
umk -B GCC.bm -A uppsrc ide
```

```
umk -A uppsrc -B GCC ide
```

```
umk -A uppsrc ide
```

It will break old umk script yes... but do we really need to stick with older and weak behavior?
Using umk in production scripts is so common nowadays?
