Lance wrote on Wed, 26 October 2022 16:00: Not sure if this problem is unique to me: on Ubuntu 22.10+UPP.16512 (and some other recent versions), "Find..." function cannot be used. Ctrl+F, type in string to search, won't work.

Another problem. Add new help topic will crash TheIDE. For a test,

- \* open "examples/AddressBook", navigate to "AddressBook.cpp" if not already in it.
- \* In the class "AddressBook", click any member variable or function to add documentation [a cyan square to the left of the function/variable line];
- \* in the popup menu, choose "New reference topic"
- \* in the "New Topic" dialog, in the Template field, change it to "Reference-en\_us (in uppsrc)"
- \* Click "OK" button

The ide crash with invalid memory access.

I am sorry. I know Mirek has been tirelessly working on integrating libclang to theide. Not criticizing, not meaning to distract, just trying to bring awareness.
