Hi Sergey,

It seems like an interesting idea. I think the description field in .upp files could be modified to store language specific strings. Application name is the same as the package directory name, so it would be a bit more complex and it is also not that important, but still possible.

BUT... The main problem I see with this proposal is the translation. No author knows all the languages, so he can't translate those descriptions by himself. A translator for given language could do that, but then he would have to have access to all the bazaar packages. Another option would be to submit each translated description to the package author separately, which would be tedious...
