So far we have migrated svn, website generation (for uppweb developers, ftp transfer at the end of website generation process is not commented out as uppweb now runs directly at the web server and stores files to /var/www) and, more or less, this forum.

What is missing is redmine - I will try to do it ASAP... And then of course, finalizing the forum migration (but I hope we can have it this ugly for a couple of days).
