If I want to store a U++ Time in DD/MM/YYYY HH:MM format in Sqlite database what do I need to do?

I'm having trouble deciding if I should use:

```
TABLE_(MY_TABLE)
  DATE_ (tm)
END_TABLE
```

or

```
TABLE_(MY_TABLE)
  TIME_ (tm)
END_TABLE
```

or even

```
TABLE_(MY_TABLE)
DATETIME_(tm)
END_TABLE
```

in .sch files.

I'm using a SqlArray control.
