Hi Edward,

By default, The IDE only shows "Main packages". Main package means that it has main package configuration (set via corresponding dialog from Project menu) and it usually contains main()/CONSOLE_APP_MAIN/GUI_APP_MAIN method.

Check the select box in lower left corner of the dialog, it allows you to display non-main packages as well and also packages from other nests in the same assembly.
