You can do that using QTF. for example:

```
tab.Add("\1[ [ [6!Arial! Test]]]");  
tab.Add("\1[ [ [4!Courier! Test]]]");
```

see the menu "Assist/QTF designer" for more infos about QTF.

I think, you can use concatenation, and escape the Qtf from the translated string:

```
tab.Add("\1[ [ [6!Arial! " + DeQtF(t_("Test")) + "]]]");  
tab.Add("\1[ [ [4!Courier! " + DeQtF(t_("Test")) + "]]]");
```
